

Public Buyers Community Platforn

The Public Buyers Community Platform complements the European Commission's strategy to improve public procurement in the EU by bringing together public authorities and other stakeholders.

Public procurers can find and join a community of practice that best fits the procurement interests and work in close collaboration with their fellow members to pool their resources, tools and expertise, and maximise their purchasing power and impact.

The Public Buyers Community Platform is a DG GROW initiative dedicated that it action in public purchasing across the EU. It is a space for European public procurers and the European Commission to meet and work together to actively advance public purchasing.

Communities of Practice



The CoPs will be embedded on the Public Buyers Community Platform

Members of each CoP will have access to members-only collaboration area

Each CoP will define its own objectives and collaboration activities to effectively address sector-specific opportunities and challenges



Communities of Practice



Overall size of the CoP will be approximately 10 entities:

1-2 Lead, steering and implementing

3-4 Implementing pilot projects and procurement contracts

3-4 Learning and contributing

Participation in the CoPs is **free** and the costs of the Members' travel to inperson meetings will be reimbursed




Who should join? And how?



BBWT invites **public purchasing organisations** such as local and regional governments, central purchasing bodies, and other public agencies.

Market actors (e.g., producers and suppliers) and industry associations will be invited to join various sessions and events, depending on the focus and needs of the CoPs.

Potential variations among CoPs



Type of activities are heavily influenced by factors such as:

- Structure and nature of market, and market actors, in the focus sector
- Nature of the product addressed
- Differences in national procurement regulations and practices
- Specificity of the defined need
- Level of experience and advancement of the CoP participants
- Status of market development
- Type of procurement entities involved
- ➤ No single template for CoP activities!

Benefits from participation in CoP



- Regular CoP meetings (online and in person) latest updates on pilots, market intelligence, support in developing tender documentation and criteria
- Market dialogue sessions variety of formats with both individual and groups of suppliers
- Study visits/learning expeditions
- Capacity building sessions with external experts
- Producers' pitching sessions
- Collaboration on common market statements

- Understanding of the needs and challenges of public buyers
- Insight into upcoming procurement plans
- Promotion of the alignment of procurement criteria and standards in public tenders
