- Is demand driven and does not require any co-financing from Member States

TSI practical experience on reform projects

- ☐ Since 2017 the Commission has provided technical support to all 27 Member States with more than 1,400 projects in a broad range of policy areas.
- ☐ TSI plays an important role in supporting EU Member States in **implementing the commitments** of the **EU Green Deal**.



- TSI experience in the area of **public procurement** has grown bigger every year. Projects have been (or are being) carried out in **several Member States**, covering a **large part of the EU**, from Ireland, through Lithuania, Slovenia, Croatia and Hungary to Malta.
- ☐ The expertise comes **recognised experts** in the area of the support needs. It can also come from **other Member States that share their experience** of implementing **similar reforms**.

TSI 2023 flagship on public procurement – spill-over benefits through sharing

- ☐ Flagship on **professionalisation of public procurement** aims to reinforce capacities in
 Member States to **run public procurement procedures effectively,** including in relation to
 investments provided by the RRPs.
- This will enhance the quality of public spending through increased use of <u>strategic procurement</u> <u>methodologies</u>, including <u>green procurement</u>.



- Flagship is expected to <u>have spill-over benefits</u> to Member States that might not express an interest in the initiative, notably <u>through sharing of lessons</u> <u>learnt and key deliverables in EU wide context</u>.
- As an example, in the framework of an ongoing TSI project on promoting green procurement in Hungary, an international conference on green procurement and life cycle costing has been organised that attracted more than 500 participants from all over the EU.

Promoting green public procurement in HU, focusing on life-cycle costing (LLC)

 The main objective is to support the Hungarian Government in developing and promoting the use of green public procurement criteria, and especially of life-cycle costing (LCC) tools.

- The support includes the development of product-specific LCC tools, which are widely accessible and easy to use, as well as promoting the incorporation of environmental criteria into public procurement.
- Current status selection of the product categories for the tools to be developed, with focus on products for which the biggest savings can be achieved both in terms of cost and environmental impact).



In the framework of the project, an international conference on green procurement and life cycle costing has been organised that attracted more than 500 participants from all over the EU.
