About GovTech4All



Startup Challenge

- A pilot to test open innovation process and innovative procurement at a cross border European level
- Identifying, piloting and scaling digital solutions to help European municipalities to use energy more efficiently.
- Piloting GovTech open innovation process for the first time at a cross border European level.
- Employing the innovative procurement method of Design Contest to evaluate and select the best solution to the identified challenges and run a pilot with the winning startup.

The main objectives

- Bridging the gap between startup innovation and public institutions.
- Innovation skills: local gov's identify, test and scale innovative solutions.
- Innovative procurement: set a precedent in the use of Design Contest to procure innovation.

GovTech open innovation process



What is a design contest?

- Traditionally used in design works and architecture.
- It is a procedure which enables the contracting authority to acquire a plan or design after being put out to competition.
- Design contests may be organised in view of awarding prizes (with payments) and/ or service contracts by means of a follow-up negotiated procedure without publication.

Why design contest?

- Creates openness to different solutions and allows to collect the best concepts and ideas with broader needs requirements.
- Can continue with the best ideas into the negotiated procedure without publication, no additional open procurement needed.
- More flexible jury's evaluation criteria.

Why design contest?

- Prizes encourage smaller players and startups.
- Anonymity can help deal with the biases towards big and well known companies.
- Can be used for pilots or full scale solutions.
- No burden of proof for the need of innovation.

Lessons learned

- Important to create a network of GovTech practitioners with diverse backgrounds, from investment to procurement. The dissemination of their involvement to their networks attracts additional experts, benefiting the larger project community.
- Start-ups value the **varied expertise and methodological approaches**, they found value in particular in listening to a **pan-European perspective**.
- Theory can be useful, but only when clearly linked to the real-world implications. The content of the Boot Camp's works best when it is specific and practical.

Lessons learned

- Startups appreciate and look for closer ties with the demand side of innovation. More government stakeholders will be involved in upcoming challenge definition processes.
- The companies felt that the **relationships made face to face build a stronger sense of community** and suggest that future programmes include an in-person activity.
- Companies appreciate tailored feedback and advice.

- Encourages participation of startups (through innovative procurement or sub-granting)
