About the project

<u>Big Buyers Working Together (BBWT)</u> is a European Commission project, launched in March 2023, to support collaboration between public buyers with strong purchasing power and promote the wider use of strategic public procurement for innovative and sustainable solutions.

The project strongly believes that by working together and pooling their resources, cities, central purchasing bodies, and other major public buyers can maximise their market power and impact. Ten Communities of Practice (CoPs) were created in the framework of this project, allowing public buyers to explore different sectors, such as zero emission construction sites, heavy-duty electric vehicles, circular construction, sustainable solar panels, mobility, digital, socially responsible public procurement, the New European Bauhaus, healthcare efficiency and sustainability.

The annual event aims at bringing CoP members and relevant stakeholders together to connect on the work of the past year and to propose discussions on where strategic public procurement in Europe is heading. The event will facilitate collaboration and interactions among members from different CoPs and it will give the possibility of sharing challenges and good practice. It will also allow individual CoPs meetings to continue the momentum amongst each group.

11:15 - 12:30	The future of the Public Procurement Landscape This interactive session aims to gather feedback by the audience for policy makers in light of the revision of the Directives. A public procurement legal expert will do a presentation about the functioning of the current Directives and predictions/proposals for the future. The presentation will be followed by an interactive session with attendees, breaking into small groups to consider the biggest challenges they face, and the proposals for how these can be overcome.

13:30 - 15:00	Capacity Building & Interactive session on the role of Market Dialogues This session will be guided by an expert and it will be split into two parts: 1. Capacity building (30 mins) on the role of market dialogues and how to best carry them out. 2. Interactive Session, where the audience will be divided into groups. Each group, in 15 mins, will have to design the best possible market dialogue for procurement, following the themes provided by the expert. Each group will have one scribe who will remain in place. After about 15 min, the groups change places, the scribe stays, and the scribe tells their new group what was discussed in the group and the new group continues to develop the idea. There will be three rounds. For the remaining 15 mins, the scribes will present to the audience the main solutions from their groups.
